Spotlight on PAHO



- 8 countries in PAHO region have national plans, although not all sufficiently funded and operational. These include:
- 7 countries within the region are currently developing a National Dementia Plan
- However Large gaps remain



Spotlight on Brazil



- Dementia was the 2nd leading cause of death in individuals aged 70 and above in 2016.
- 1.8 million people were expected to be living in Brazil with dementia in 2019.
- This figure is expected to rise to 5.6 million by 2030
- Brazil does not currently have a National Dementia Plan.
- Brazil was one of seven countries to participate in Strengthening responses to dementia (STRIDE)























World Alzheimer Report 2019

- The report reveals the results of the largest attitudes to dementia survey ever undertaken, with almost 70,000 people across 155 countries and territories completing the survey.
- Brazil was the largest respondent to the survey of any country.
